

BIOARCHAEOLOGY FIELD PROGRAM

Illinois State University



Purpose: To provide hands-on lab experience to qualified graduate and undergraduate students. This consists of paleopathological diagnostics as well as project-oriented data collection.

Eligibility: Enrolled graduate student at ISU have the highest priority. Undergraduates and non-ISU students need to apply (e-mail to msmith@ilstu.edu by March 1). ISU students must be enrolled for ANTH 381 or ANTH 481.

Dates: Projected dates for 2012 are May 21-June 15. Subject to change pending museum scheduling.

Place: Frank H. McClung Museum, Knoxville Tennessee.

Field excursions: Weekend trips include Fort Loudon (reconstructed French and Indian War frontier fort) and the Sequoia Birthplace Museum in Vonore, Tennessee and the Museum of the Cherokee Indian and Oconoluftee Village on the Cherokee Indian Reservation, Cherokee, North Carolina.

Accommodations: Student housing is arranged. Students should bring work casual clothing. Fees and budget to be posted.
